Key messages

The local event was organised in the framework of the EWRCs - Future of Europe initiative within the partnership "Green Islands for sustainable cohesion policy", composed by Sardinia Region, Balearic Islands, Corsica and Crete. The political debate focused on the importance of Cohesion Policy funds in addressing insularity - Philip VON BROCKDORFF, Member of the Board of Directors UHM Voice of the challenges. Specific measures need to be identified at EU level to compensate for the disadvantages related to territorial discontinuity: accessibility, limited internal markets, energy supply. One of the key messages from the event was that, despite the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, Article 174, which recognizes that particular attention shall be paid to islands because of their specific condition, actions taken by the EU to implement this provision are considered inadequate. The cohesion policy post-2020 could represent a unique opportunity to allow citizens - Raffaele PACI, Regional Minister for Budget, Credit and Planning of Sardinia Re- and business of EU islands to compete on an equal footing with other territories.

Pigliaru: "As island regions we are carrying out a joint initiative to call on both our respective Governments and the EU to allow us more flexibility in spending the financial resources to compensate for the disadvantages related to insularity status. This is a battle to ensure the principle of equality of Sardinian people and the other EU islanders, and more generally to guarantee the same competitive conditions other EU regions have".
